Qualitative research involves collecting and analyzing non-numerical data (e.g., text, video, or audio) to understand concepts, opinions, or experiences. It can be used to

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gather in-depth insights into a problem or generate new ideas for research. Qualitative research is the opposite of quantitative research, which involves collecting and analyzing numerical data for statistical analysis.

Qualitative research is based on the disciplines of social sciences like psychology, sociology, and anthropology. Therefore, the qualitative research methods allow for in-depth and further probing and questioning of respondents based on their responses, where the interviewer/researcher also tries to understand their motivation and feelings.

Qualitative Research Defined Qualitative research studies typically seek to answer questions about the 'what', 'how', and 'why' of phenomena. This is in contrast to the questions of 'how many' or 'how much'

What is qualitative research? Qualitative research is all about language. That covers words, meanings and understanding. It's used to describe why people feel the way they do, why they act in a certain way, what opinions they have and what motivates them. Qualitative research gives breadth, depth and context to questions, although its linguistic subtleties mean that results are trickier to analyse than quantitative data.
